∞ A Letter from the President ∞

If you have been reading the recent newsletters, you know Board of Directors Elections were held last month. We have added some new board members and some of the executive board positions have changed which you will be hearing about. I was elected as the new Shady Oaks President; so today I'd like to tell you about myself.

First I'd like to acknowledge and give thanks to the great contributions of our past president, Charlene Baum. She has given outstanding caring and dedication to camp for many years. Her commitment toward camp remains exceptional. She continues to hold a position on the board of directors and I'm sure she will keep an eye on me, and keep me in line.

My wife Sharon and I have a daughter, Lisa, whose primary diagnosis is cerebral palsy. She is 28 and has attended camp for 5 years now. The first couple years for 1 session, and the last couple years for 2 sessions. She lives at home with us in Homer Glen. She really enjoys coming to camp each year and makes new friends each year. She attends the Lutheran Social Services workshop Monday-Friday located on camp property between the Shady Oaks group homes. She is the only non-resident that attends their program, so we drop her off and pick her up every day.

I retired from working for the Federal Aviation Administration in 2010. I was an air traffic controller for over 28 years with the last 19 being a supervisor at the enroute center located in Aurora, IL. Yes, that was stressful and I could tell plenty of stories about working there. So after I retired, Scott Steele (how can you not like this guy) starts with "can you help with some lawn mowing this week?" At first it was once a week, then maybe twice a week, then take home a few weed-whackers here or leaf blowers there for some minor repair. (that's Scott casting the fishing line) So, in February 2011, I was added to the Board of Directors. Then, this past winter and spring my helping grew into devoting up to 40 hours a week working at camp to assist in the rehab of building 1 and the pool house. (now Scott's reeling the fishing line in!) I do enjoy working with my hands, doing any type of home repair, light construction or yard work. So that is why I volunteered for the newly created building and maintenance committee. Scott Steele, Harry Burroughs, Ralph Swanson, the caretaker and myself will be the focal group for work on the facility and grounds. We also now have a newly created fundraising committee, and a records and retention committee

There have been a lot of exciting things happening at Shady Oaks over the last few years. I hope to carry on the 65-year tradition of camp and maybe bring some new ideas so we can continue operating for many years to come. I think we all share the same goal of having a place for our special need camper to come to each year for fun, enjoyment, making friends and recreation.
