When Mary first heard about Shady Oaks Camp nearly 40 years ago, it was through a connection at her daughter's high school. One of the staff members had a brother who attended the camp, a small conversation that would lead to a lifelong connection filled with devotion, growth, and advocacy. Mary officially became part of the Shady Oaks Camp family in 1985, and what began as a mother's cautious curiosity blossomed into a powerful legacy.

Karen, Mary's daughter, was a longtime camper who had a vibrant personality and a heart full of kindness. Born with a seizure disorder requiring round-the-clock care, Karen had never spent a night away from home. "My first reaction was fear," Mary recalled. "At that time, I didn't think anyone could take care of her the way I did." Yet Mary took a leap of faith, and in doing so, she gave Karen one of the most treasured experiences of her life.

Karen flourished at Shady Oaks. She loved the social interaction and was known for helping other campers and staff. Her warmth and friendliness left a lasting impression. "Karen loved to interact with everyone," Mary shared. Her daughter's independent spirit began to shine. "She told her counselor and all the staff that her mom was going to pick her up, so she repacked her suitcase every day," Mary remembers fondly. Eventually, the staff had to hide the suitcase but Karen never stopped saying, "Mom is going to pick me up." It was a charming reminder of their bond, even as she found a second home at camp.

In 1987, just two years after Karen became a camper, Mary joined the Board of Directors. Since then, she has remained a vital part of Shady Oaks Camp's leadership, offering a unique perspective as both a parent and advocate. Her commitment has helped shape the camp's continued success and evolution. Mary has long encouraged new families to explore the camp firsthand: "Go out and see the camp. Talk to other parents. Depending on your child's needs, see if the camp can support them, and always follow up to see how they are adjusting."

Karen passed away in 2020, leaving behind a legacy of joy, resilience, and deep compassion. Her memory continues to live on in every campfire song, every laugh shared on the playground, and every camper who finds courage to take their first step away from home. Mary's enduring commitment ensures that Shady Oaks Camp remains a place where love, inclusion, and belonging come first.

Together, Mary and Karen's story is a testament to what Shady Oaks has meant to so many families: a safe haven, a stepping stone, and a forever home. Their legacy will continue to inspire the camp's mission for generations to come.


